# **Diocese to Welcome New Bishop This Fall**

The Diocese of Bethlehem prepares to ordain **The Reverend Canon Kevin D. Nichols** as our next Bishop this fall. He was called by the Special Electing Convention on April 28 where St. Luke's was represented by voting delegates **Carol Guzzi, David Wegner**, and **The Reverend Rebecca Barnes** who also served as Master of Ceremonies at the convention eucharist.

The Bishop-elect currently serves in the Diocese of New Hampshire, where he presided over their Standing Committee. He served as Rector of St Stephen's in Pittsfield and St Andrew's in Hopkinton. A former Roman Catholic priest, he received his Master of Divinity degree from St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, Maryland. He was received into the Episcopal priesthood in 1999. "I am thrilled to be joining with the people of the Diocese of Bethlehem to bear witness to the power of the Resurrection in their communities," Nichols said. "The momentum there is unmistakable and I can't wait to see what God has in store for us together."

The ordination of Canon Nichols as the IX Bishop of Bethlehem is to be held at First Presbyterian Church in Allentown, Pennsylvania on **September 15**. The anticipated crowd is so large as to preclude the use of any our local Episcopal churches.

Canon Nichols continued "I see this as a moment for us as a church to recover our purpose for why we are here, to reconcile and to offer God's love and healing where there has been painful damage. The Diocese of Bethlehem in its diverse landscapes is rich and fertile
