

The week between Palm Sunday and Easter is called Holy WEEK. This is the week when we celebrate the mighty deeds that Jesus, the Messiah, did to set us free from sin and death.

Tesus came to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, to celebrate the Passover, the great Jewish festival of freedom. At Passover, God's people remember how he set them free from slavery in Egypt. We call Jesus's Passover celebration "The Last Supper," because he died the next day. We remember the Last Supper on Thursday of Holy Week. We learn how Jesus gave the Passover a new meaning by what he did that night and the next day.

This Thursday is sometimes called MAUNDY THURSDAY. "Maundy" means "commandment." At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his

disciples a new commandment to live by!
