
The Lesavage-Skoronski Duo

Welcome

St. Luke's is an inclusive, historic parish in downtown Scranton with a rich history of musical excellence. We understand the importance of music as an integral part of our liturgy and worship. Our music program encompasses the many great singing traditions of the Anglican Church, from the simplistic elegance of the Plainsong Psalter to the sublime complexity of the polyphonic Choral Mass. Our professional singers, under the direction of Maria Zengion, organist and choirmaster, dedicate themselves to the discipline of historically informed performance practice of polyphonic music.

We have a long standing commitment to the arts and sharing our sacred space with the greater community so that all may enjoy the beauty of music. We especially value our affiliations with numerous musical and performing art organizations in Scranton including our Artist-in-Residence The Lyric Consort, Arcadia Chorale, the Choral Society of Northeastern Pennsylvania, and the NEPA Philharmonic.

St. Luke's pipe organ has 33 stops, 40 ranks, and 2,323 pipes. Originally built by M. P. Möller (Opus 9916, 1964), it was upgraded in 2017 by the Reuter Organ Company. We have a Steinway B (6'11") piano in our nave, and a Yamaha G2 in our parish house.
